



ACTIVE MOBILE SOCIAL USERS AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE TOTAL POPULATION







Three-quarters of Facebook users and half of Instagram users use each site daily


Among the users of each social networking site, % who use these sites ...



Small World Network Theory (tie strength)

Clay Shirky: Bonding & Bridging Capital

BRIDGING: Increase in connections among heterogeneous groups. Tends to be more inclusive.



When I have the opportunity I love to speak and write about digital marketing strategy, digital fundraising, online youth engagement, website analytics, and of course digital currency.

I've been honoured to be recognized by some wonderful organizations, including the 2014 NTEN Award for contributions to the nonprofit technology community. Most recently, I was awarded Young Alumnus of the Year by the Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association, which recognizes the outstanding achievements by a young alumnus.

Some other projects I've been involved with include The Fastest Donation Form in the World Project, where I initiated and led the development of a proof of concept to explore the question, "What would the fastest donation form in the world look like?".
