CASE STATEMENT

WHO WE ARE

For nearly a century, the Minneapolis Jewish community has worked collectively to shape Jewish history and address human suffering. The thread that connects us to one another and to this collaborative enterprise is rooted in two core Jewish values: *tzedakah* (justice) and *kol yisrael arevim zeh lazeh* (all Jews are responsible for each other).

Our parents and grandparents created the Minneapolis Jewish Federation to serve as the community convener and to leverage community resources. Their noble goal remains worthwhile: To build a Jewish community capable of ensuring continuity, securing the State of Israel, and meeting the needs of Jews in Minneapolis, Israel and around the world.
